Annual Report for the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 2016

The Lower Dauphin Falcon Foundation (LDFF) was established in 2007 and continues to expand its community recognition and involvement, sponsored programs, fundraising activities, and funded projects.

Foundation Fundraising and Events

To support the mission of the foundation, fundraising activities are designed to engage a broad representation of individuals in the Lower Dauphin community, as well as to reach individuals outside of the community with an affiliation to or an interest in Lower Dauphin. Our list of donors and contributors is evidence that many individuals and businesses believe in our mission. Through their generosity, we met our 2015-2016 fundraising goals. This foundation continues to gain recognition, strength, and endorsement from our community to support our mission.

Blue & White Gala

The eighth annual Blue and White Gala, *Back to the Gala*, was held on January 30, 2016 at the Hall of Champions, Hollywood Casino. Tim Bartholomew, graduating class of '76, served as master of ceremonies.

The theme for this year's event was "Back to the Future" and featured Lower Dauphin's Blackboard Brothers' "rock 'n' roll" band. The band, which had been made up of elementary school teachers, performed classic music from the 1950s and 60s. The band members are now retired and last performed in 2013. Bartholomew plays lead guitar in the band, and is known for his service to Lower Dauphin School District as a fifth-grade teacher at Nye Elementary School. He continues to be involved in the district's Outdoor Education Program at Camp Hebron in Halifax.

The Gala featured a full course dinner, and entertainment by the Blackboard Brothers and a music DJ. There was also a silent and live auction. Approximately 158 guests were in attendance at this year's event. The event raised over \$14,494 through tickets sales, donations, and the live and silent auctions. The Gala was chaired by Dr. Judith Witmer.

Ninth Annual Lower Dauphin Falcon Foundation Golf Outing

On Friday, April 22, 2016, the Ninth Annual LDFF Golf Outing took place at the Deer Valley Golf Club Course in Hummelstown, and raised over \$8,900. A reception followed at Deer Valley. The Tournament Board members were Jody Dimpsey, Norm Stine, Rick Smith, Jessica DeHart, Terry and Patience Bashore. Dr. Bob and Sue Dahmus, El Associates, Jody Dimpsey, and Capital Blue Cross were this year's Gold Sponsors.

Dinner Theater Event

Once again, the LD High School Spring Musical provided an opportunity for the foundation to support the arts, increase the visibility to the community, and fundraise. A dinner theater was held prior to the Friday evening performance of "The Addams Family" on March 4, 2016 receiving a profit of \$957 with ten percent of the proceeds donated to the LD theater program.

This was the eighth year for the Dinner Theater that had 88 people in attendance.

Annual Campaign

The success of any educational foundation is predicated on the ability to raise funds from community members and individuals with a prior or current affiliation with the school. In a continuing effort to reach out to these individuals, educate them about LDFF, and gather contributions to support our mission, the Annual Campaign was held in the fall of 2015.

A mailing was sent to potential donors in late October, with materials describing the foundation and its mission, as well as requests for donations. The campaign continued to be a success for the foundation raising over \$3,324.

Field House Campaign

The field house campaign continued through the 2015-2016 year. An additional \$32,033 in funds were raised. There was also a Falcon Fest held on Saturday, August 22nd at the Historic Hersheypark Arena. There were 208 people in attendance with a profit of over \$20,000.

Foundation Grants

The foundation again solicited grant applications from Lower Dauphin faculty, staff, students, and community members during two cycles this past year. Criteria for approval included, among other items, consistency with LDFF's mission, the number of students impacted, and the innovative aspects of the grant. Grant applications represented a broader range of ideas, applicants, students impacted, and locations. The foundation is proud to have provided the funding for the following:
